- Click on



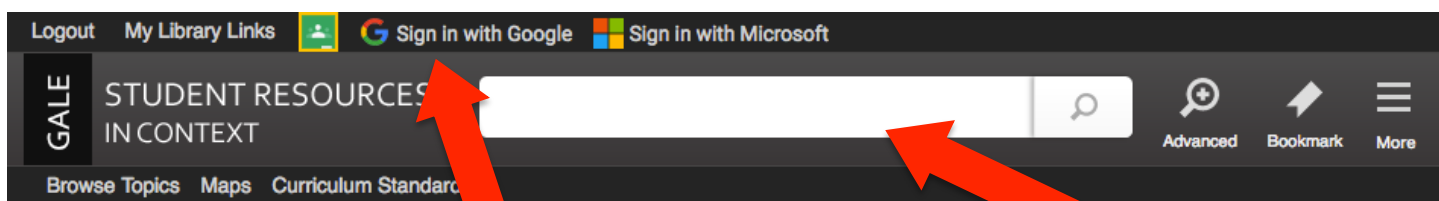

Getting started

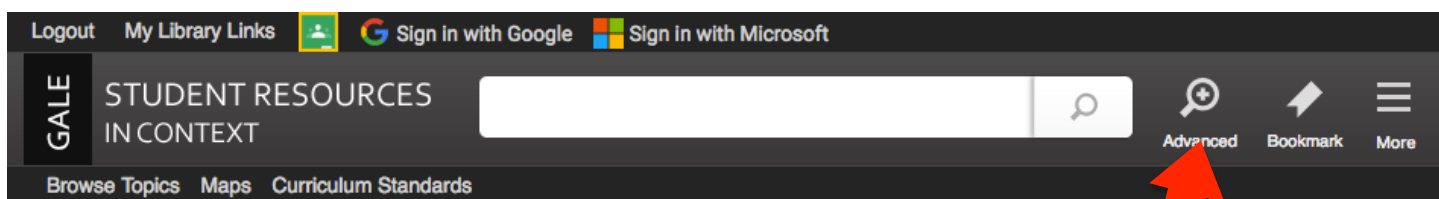
- This is the main menu area

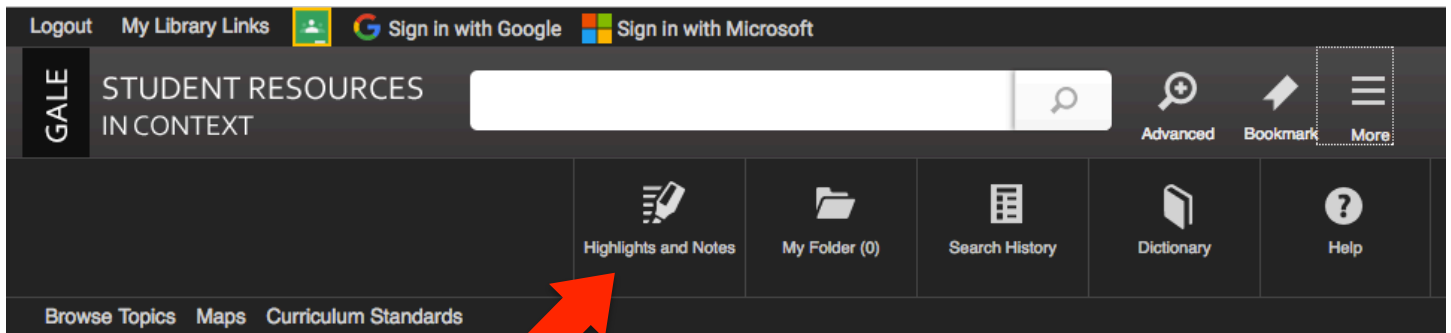

More tab

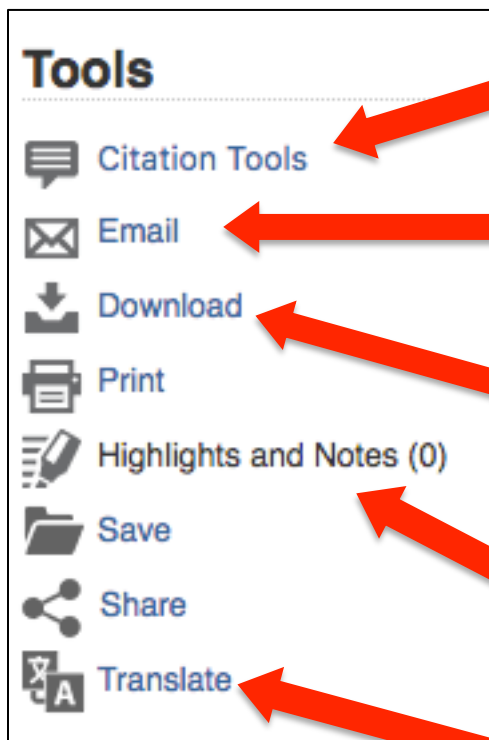
- When you click “More” you will get a drop-down screen that looks like this:
